THE HOLE IN OUR HOLINESS

DR DAVID SMITH | INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR – IBCM NETWORK



Be Holy as I am Holy – is an inescapable command from both Testaments.

The genesis of our tradition is heavily influenced by the holiness movement and our churches past and present have made much of the pursuit of holiness as essential for a "good" Christian life. Actually the focus of much of Christianity can be summed up by the words "right belief and right action." But if we believe this, there is a big hole in our holiness. Even today much energy is spent on cultivating personal piety; following commands, attending, praying, giving, reading Scripture, witnessing, and making sure to does are done and the do nots are avoided. These things are all good and are right to be pursued, but the area of relationships is a gaping hole in our common understanding of holiness. As a result our holiness often leads to us judging rather than embracing each other. That can't be right! It's like we have excised 1 John 4 and 1 Corinthians 13 from our understanding. We have left invitation, welcome, compassion, forgiveness, mercy, grace, real community, the loving of one another as God loves us, out of our understanding of holiness. When was the last time you heard someone say, "That person is so holy, they love and forgive so much?" Is it possible that we have pursued personal holiness, excluded relational holiness, and find ourselves branded by society as resounding gongs?

India is in the fourth position among the nations with the rise of Covid 19 cases. As on 2nd July, 2020 there are 6,05,808 people affected and 17,850 people who died because of Covid

19. Fifty percent of those affected have recovered according to the official reports.

Central government has announced relaxation on lockdown situation. Domestic flights are operating in a minimal phase. The train service is partially on operation. Interstate travel is

allowed with guidelines announced by the health department, specific for each state.

percentage of deaths was at 0.1%.



Asia Pacific (PITH) Regional Conference Committee is organising a series of Webinars starting on 1 August 2020.



BOOKS RECOMMENDED




JOHN LENNOX, WHERE IS GOD IN CORONAVIRUS WORLD, by Stephen McQuoid

At the very start of the lockdown I got the excellent little book by John Lennox Where is God in a Coronavirus World. It is a brief and rapidly produced book which does a brilliant job of speaking into the current situation. It is written in John's characteristic style, both thoughtful and accessible. John starts by recognising how anxious people are about the Covid 19 pandemic, though he does note very helpfully, that viruses are by no means new and many of the viruses in the past have

been more devastating than this one. He then goes on to a short section on suffering before asking the important question, can Atheism help? His clear point is that when a crisis such as this happens it matters a great deal what you believe because a worldview such as Atheism has nothing to offer. Next he tackles the thorny question of God's love in the face of such suffering. His answers, while brief, are good, both honest and realistic. He finishes off by focussing on the hope of eternity and the huge difference that belief in God makes at a times like these. This is a book that Christians would find encouraging but could easily be used evangelistically. I gave mine away to a neighbour to whom I have been witnessing. The modest price tag should also make the distribution of this book possible.


FARES MARZONE - THE REFORMATION AND THE BRETHREN MOVEMENT IN ITALY

Most readers may be surprised by the topic of this work. Few are familiar with this important part of the Reformation, and most English-language Church history texts give it scant notice if any at all. This book fills a gap, since no comprehensive book on this movement from its nineteenth century planting in Italy until the end of the twentieth

century has been published in English.

Fares Marzone has done a great service to the English-language reader by making readily available this history and is to be commended for both his labours and this book, the fruit of his labours.




DAVID SMITH - THE MODEL CHURCH
